Community Care Access Centres were established by the Ministry of Health and Long-term Care to provide access to government-funded home and community health services, information and referral to other health and related support services and access to long-term care homes. The South East CCAC is one of 14 CCACs in Ontario working together with community partners to coordinate a variety of health services to help maintain an individual's health, independence and quality of life.

CCAC staff can assist in planning and making informed choices about health care options. We work in partnership with clients, families, care providers, physicians, hospitals, long-term care centres and others to ensure that the right care is available at the right time and place.

With offices in Bancroft, Belleville, Brockville, Kingston, Northbrook, Selby and Smiths Falls, the South East Community Care Access Centre serves a population 442,800 people.
